



# Study Abroad Goals Assessment

## Instructions

Use this worksheet to guide you through the process of identifying your study abroad goals and choosing a study abroad program. After completing this worksheet, bring it to your advising appointment, where your advisor can use your responses to focus the appointment on your individual needs and assist you in moving forward with your study abroad planning.

## Step 1: Identify Goals

The first step to study abroad is to identify your goals. What is important to you in a study abroad experience? Considering your goals carefully is important, because it will help guide you in finding the right program for you, based on your interests and priorities.

Below are factors you may consider when choosing a program. The questions are only a few examples of things to think about for each factor.

<b>Academic Offerings</b> Do you want to earn credit toward your major, minor, distribution, or other requirements?	<b>Career Path</b> Do you want to participate in specific courses and/or extracurricular activities that are important in your intended field?		<b>Finances</b> Are you looking for a program that does not study abroad?
<b>Housing</b> Do you want to live in a student dormitory or other on-campus option? Do you want to live in a homestay?		<b>Language</b> Do you want to take all of your courses in a foreign language, in English, or a mix of both?	<b>Learning Environment &amp; Style</b> Do you want to take classes with other Northwestern students or with other study abroad students, either from US or foreign institutions?
<b>Location &amp; Geographic Interests</b> Do you want to study abroad in a specific country or region of the world?	<b>Personal Identity</b> What aspects of your personal identity are important to consider when studying abroad? Are there locations that may be more safe and comfortable spaces for you to express your personal identity?		
		<b>Program Type</b> Do you want to participate in a program designed and administered by Northwestern? Do you want to directly enroll in a partner university as an exchange student?
